Memorial Day is widely accepted as the unofficial start of the summer season. This year numerous celebrations were held across the country, each with, perhaps, more meaning and heartfelt thanks attached since the events of September 11th. For 200-plus Mustang owners and their vehicles, the Mall of Georgia in Buford, Georgia, was the place to kick off summer with the Patriotic Pride & Appreciation National hosted by the Northeast Georgia Mustang Club.

Much like a city within a city, the Mall of Georgia is a huge complex that houses plenty of shopping opportunities, a variety of eateries, an I-Max theater, and numerous kids activities such as a bungee/trampoline jump area, a series of water fountains perfect for splashing fun, and a kid-sized train that runs (sans tracks) through the more picturesque outdoor areas. Surrounding the mall are hotels and restaurants plus several shopping centers. If you can't find what you want or need here, it probably can't be found in the state of Georgia.

The mix of Mustangs ranged from pristine concours and thoroughbred examples to driven show-off-going-down-the-road ponies, to wonderfully imaginative customized versions. Nearly every year and model was represented including three beautiful examples of the Mustang II generation. Shelbys were abundant. Bosses were on hand. Several Saleens vied for attention. Modified versions were plentiful. And each and every owner had a story just waiting to be told.

We were very pleased to see several young smiling faces patiently cleaning and guarding their prized possessions (several of those smiles came from the female side of the hobby) and we had the opportunity to look over ponies we don't recall having seen before.

Friday afternoon was very low key, or so it seemed. Behind the scenes things were jumping as mall officials changed the amount of space available for the event at the last minute. Show officials quickly revamped their floor plan to ensure that all entries would have an adequate parking space.

As anticipated, Saturday morning was extremely busy with the bulk of competitors coming through tech inspection. But an efficient tech team made quick work of the task.
